

Thoughts about Stewardship

Today, we gather with people throughout our great nation as we celebrate Veterans Day. We honor and give thanks for the brave women and men who have given, as President Lincoln said, "the last full measure of devotion" for the cause of freedom. In our worship today, we witness a story in the Bible about a poor widow who goes to the Temple Treasury to make her offering to God. Jesus explains to his disciples that she gave, "out of her poverty, *all* that she had." The example of this poor widow and the example of our courageous Veterans inspires us to give *all* that we have for the sake of the Gospel.
