

#### Thoughts about Stewardship

As we gather for worship today, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. This festival is a celebration of our connection to the great women and men who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. Their example inspires us to live holy lives - lives that bring life to the world. In our Gospel text today, Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. As Lazarus came out of his tomb, Jesus told the witnesses, "unbind him and let him go."

The theme of this year's Pledge Campaign is "Marked for Mission." It is a reminder that we are marked, indeed anointed, for mission. Our Bible text today challenges us to participate actively in Christ's mission in by liberating those who are bound by sadness, addiction, and despair. As we continue our 2019 Pledge Campaign, we are encouraged today to reflect on our lives and ask:

*How am I marked for mission? How am I called to participate in the mission of Christ here at St. Andrew's?*

*How does my giving of time, talent, and treasure reflect Christ's call to bring life to the world?*
